Sumi Painting

Experience the serenity of expression through the techniques of sumi painting. Students will explore creative forms of self-expression through a variety of subjects using sumi (black ink) to interpret images as well as changes in color through tonal value. Use of traditional tools, materials, brush methods, and approach to content will be taught. Sumi will be the primary medium with opportunities to work in sumi watercolor. Students will gain an insight into the secrets of this ancient eastern tradition of self-expression.

Asian Brush Calligraphy Workshop

Asian brush calligraphy is an ancient art form that evolved over 3,000 years ago and is the precursor to sumi-e (ink painting). Students will work with the traditional tools of bamboo brush and sumi (ink) on rice paper as they are introduced to Asian characters. Students will also learn to write their names using Japanese syllabaries.
